

 - Funding partnerships



Planning Services

- Delegated Responsibility to Represent Provincial Interest in Natural Hazards
- Regulatory authority under the Conservation Authorities Act (Section 28)
- Conservation Authorities (CA's) are a commenting agency under the Planning Act for both natural hazards and natural heritage





Regulation Mapping

- Regulation Mapping originally developed in 1970's
- Mapping was last updated in 2013/14 based on:
 - · Site specific technical studies, including site visits
 - New information and data including such as updated modeling and refined wetland and watercourse mapping
 - Direct input from landowners
- Stakeholder consultation included press releases, open houses and mail outs






Low Risk Approach – Pilot Projects


- Establish and implement a low risk zone approach where there is a low risk of impact of natural hazards or features
- Streamlining permit review within low risk zone based on municipal and public feedback
 - Regulated offsets around wetlands beyond 30m and within 120m of non-provincially significant wetlands
 - Existing previously approved developed lots that are outside of hazard areas or other areas of concern

Regulated Area (Low Risk Zone)


Regulated Area (High Risk Zone)

Agricultural Engagement

- Both our Strategic Plan and Service Delivery Review reflected concerns from the agricultural community
- 2014 An Agricultural Advisory Committee was formed:
- 3 representatives from Simcoe County FA
- 1 representative from Dufferin County FA
- 1 representative from Grey County CA
- 3 NVCA Board members within the agricultural county
- Chaired by Jim Partridge, Chair Simcoe County FA

Agricultural Committee Mandate

- Serve as an information sharing body
- Increase communication with the agricultural community
- Provide input on matters referred to committee by the agricultural community regarding:
 - Stewardship programs
 - NVCA regulations
 - NVCA permit fees
 - NVCA policies





Desired Outcomes

- Increase communication between the agricultural community and NVCA
- Recognize the key importance of the agricultural community in environmental protection and enhancement of water quality.
